

NWT ON THE LAND COLLABORATIVE APPLICATION GUIDELINES

MAKING SURE YOUR PROJECT IS ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING:

The Collaborative accepts applications from:

- Not-for-profit/charitable organizations
- Indigenous government & organizations
- Municipalities
- Schools
- Individuals

The Collaborative prioritizes projects that:

- get people out on the land
- build or strengthen partnerships
- connect community members to their land, culture, language & traditions
- enhance community capacity
- are sustainable

The Collaborative does NOT accept applications that are:

- for-profit initiatives or projects that are for personal gain
- from organizations outside the NWT
- for political or partisan initiatives
- from federal or territorial governments
- projects that are exclusively for hunting or trapping, such as community hunts or trapper training. However, hunting and trapping activities may be incorporated as an important element of broader on the land project.
- not up to date on earlier reporting requirements.

COMPLETING AN APPLICATION:

Defining "On the Land" (More information on how we define "on the land" can be found on our website <u>here</u>)

- We understand "on the land" to mean that the proposed activities are taking place at a location away from the community, and, ideally, remote from the community.
- Project activities MUST involve a meaningful interaction with the land. Projects that are simply holding a meeting or conducting training in a remote location will NOT be considered.
- In some cases, it is not possible to deliver projects beyond municipal limits for reasons of safety or group type. If you are proposing a project within municipal limits, please provide an explanation on the choice of location.

The minimum funding request is \$1000.

- There is no maximum amount however there is a limit of funds to be dispersed to projects across the NWT.
- Funds granted typically range between \$1,000 to \$50,000, though this is not an official maximum for granting amounts.
- Average amount granted ranges between \$15,000-\$20,000.

Eligible/Ineligible Expenses

- Project/camp related expenses such as renting equipment/cabins are eligible expenses.
- Administrative fees are NOT an eligible expense.
 - A 5% administration fee will be considered for "Administrative Hosts" to support individual applications.
- Hiring people, such as Elders, cultural instructors, boat drivers, camp attendants, etc. to support your on the land project are considered eligible expenses.
 - Existing organization staff wages or funds solely going to a contractor are NOT an eligible expense.
 - Paying participants is NOT an eligible expense and should not be included in the budget.
- Capital costs such as infrastructure (*e.g.*, *cabins*) and assets (*e.g.*, *snowmobiles*, *boats*, *etc.*) under \$5,000 will be considered for repairs or to replace broken, damaged or run-down equipment to sustain long running projects.
 - These costs must be reviewed and approved by funding partners prior to purchasing.
 - Capital costs are **NOT** eligible for individual applications.
- Collaborative strongly encourage applicants to use in-territory service providers.

SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

Individual Applicants

- A letter of support from an organization that can serve as the "administrative host" for applications from individuals **MUST** be submitted with the application.
 - You can find more resources for individual application on our website, including a sample <u>template</u> that you're an administration host can use to fill out.

Role of Community Advisors

- Collaborative strongly encourages you to reach out to your Community Advisor who are located within each region, who are there to support you through the application process.
- All applications **MUST** be submitted to the regional Community Advisor (see below)
 - If the Community Advisor is currently vacant, please submit to support@nwtontheland.ca
 - Late applications will be not accepted.

- We will provide you with a <u>template</u> to make things easier. A copy of the template can also be found on our website.
